Heating Bill Assistance Again Available

Help with home heating bills is once again available for 2010-11 winter heating season.

Applications for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (or LIEAP, pronounced lee-ap) became available in September.

LIEAP helps low-income and fixed-income families and senior citizens cover the costs of home heating.

Those who used LIEAP last year will automatically have an application mailed to them. If you didn't receive an application by

the end of September, call Wyoming LIEAP Services at 800-246-4221.

After Sept. 25, applications also became available on DFS' website, at senior centers and at Cheyenne Light.

Nearly 15,000 Wyoming households were served by LIEAP last year. Some households also benefitted from the weatherization program, in which volunteers seal drafty doors and windows and perform other basic safety checks on furnaces.
