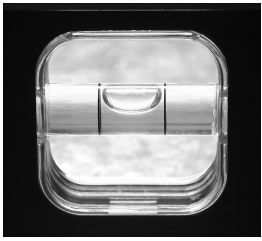
Help for The Upcoming Winter Energy Season
